August is "Ohio Month" at GWNMM

The George Washington National Masonic Memorial (GWNMM) recognizes a Grand Jurisdiction each month. Ohio is being recognized during the month of August, 2012.

To celebrate this recognition, Most Worshipful Brother Todd has planned a trip to Alexandria, Virginia, August 3rd through the 5th. Buses are scheduled to depart from and return to the ten Scottish Rite locations in Ohio. Prices are based on double occupancy and will vary depending upon the specific departure location.

Busses will depart on Friday morning and arrive at the Sheraton Suites Hotel in Old Town Alexandria late afternoon/early evening. The Grand Lodge of Ohio will confer the Master Mason Degree at the GWNMM on Fellow Crafts from throughout Ohio beginning at 9:00 A.M. Saturday morning. Saturday afternoon, the Grand Lodge of Ohio will lay a wreath at the tomb of the Unknown Soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery. Prior to returning home on Sunday, we will attend church services at the National Cathedral.

There will be a program for the ladies on Saturday at the Memorial while the MM Degree is being conferred.

An interesting note is that as this Master Mason Degree is being conferred on August 4, 2012, Brother George Washington received his MM Degree on the very same day 259 years ago on August 4, 1753!

Wearing of Appendant Order's Aprons

Most Worshipful Brother Kevin B. Todd has indicated that only Symbolic Lodge Aprons are to worn in tyled Lodge meetings with one exception. Advancing or elected line officers of appendant orders may wear the apron of their office at a Lodge meeting.

This would mean, for example, elected or advancing officers of Grand Chapter Royal Arch, Grand Council, or Grand Commandery would be permitted to wear the apron of their office, if they so chose in a tyled Lodge meeting.
