Purpose:

The purpose of this presentation is to encourage the Brethren to increase their appreciation for the Fellow Craft degree through discussion.

To be read to the Lodge: In the Grand Lodge of Ohio's Basic Education Course for the Fellow Craft degree, we read "The Seven Steps symbolize the Seven Liberal Arts and Sciences." We also read "The study of the Seven Liberal Arts was considered a means to the knowledge of God" and "that the proper study of the Seven Liberal Arts guided the intellect to approach the hidden light behind the world." Lastly, we read "that the humble mason who had mastered the Seven Liberal Arts was entitled to the designation of architect."

(Note: Here are some questions you should pose to the Brethren of the Lodge to promote a discussion of this material. It may prove helpful to share this topic with the Brethren some time in advance of the meeting to give them time to read and refresh their memories as well as gather their thoughts on this topic.)
